**INVENTORY DOWN 3 PERCENT:** U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 1990 is estimated at 54.4 million head, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. This is 3 percent below both last year and June 1, 1988.

- Breeding inventory, at 7.18 million head, is 2 percent below last year and 5 percent below two years ago.
- Market hog inventory, at 47.2 million head, is 3 percent below a year ago and 3 percent below June 1, 1988.

The 10 Quarterly States, with 42.9 million head on June 1, 1990, are down 2 percent from last year and down 3 percent from two years ago. These 10 States account for approximately 79 percent of the total U.S. hog and pig inventory. The 16 major States at 49.7 million head, account for approximately 91 percent of the U.S. inventory.

**REVISION:** The March 1, 1990 U.S. inventory was reduced by 1 percent.

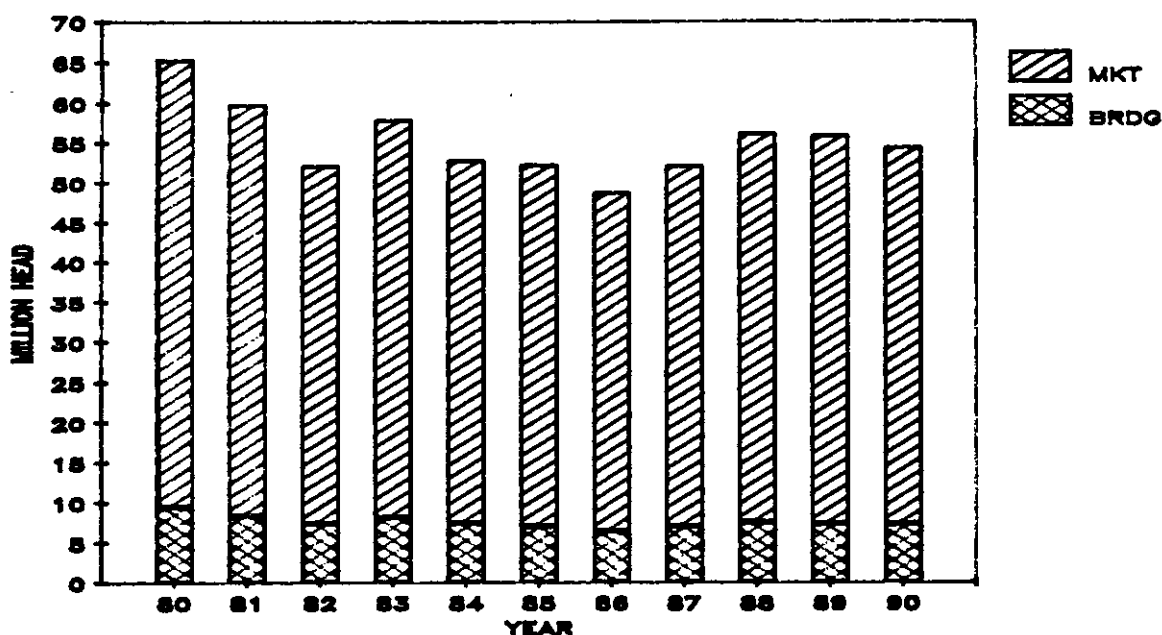
**PIG CROP:** The December 1989 - May 1990 U.S. pig crop was 45.2 million head, 4 percent below last year and 4 percent below the same period in 1988. Sows farrowing during this 6 month period, at 5.7 million head, were 5 percent less than both last year and 1988. Pigs saved per litter was 7.90, a new record high for the period, compared with 7.82 last year and 7.77 two years ago. The March - May U.S. pig crop was 25.0 million head, 4 percent below a year earlier.

In the 10 Quarterly States, the December-May pig crop was 35.4 million head, 4 percent below last year and 1988. The March-May pig crop at 19.6 million head was 3 percent below the past year and 3 percent below two years ago. In the 16 major States, March - May pig crop of 22.8 million head was 4 percent below last year.

**FARROWING INTENTIONS:** U.S. hog producers intend to have 5.82 million sows farrow during the June - November period, a 1 percent increase from the actual sows farrowed during 1989 but 4 percent below two years ago. Farrowings for the June-August period are expected to be slightly below last year while September-November farrowings are expected to be 2 percent above a year earlier.

Intentions in the 10 Quarterly States for June-November are 4.56 million head, up 1 percent from the corresponding period last year but 2 percent below two years ago. June-August intended farrowings, at 2.32 million head are down slightly from the comparable quarter in 1989. September-November intended farrowings, at 2.24 million head, are up 2 percent from last year.

## JUNE 1 HOGS AND PIGS INVENTORY UNITED STATES



**RELIABILITY AND ESTIMATING PROCEDURES:** Primary data used in setting these hogs and pigs estimates were obtained from a sample of producers across the U.S. using probability surveys. These surveys collected information as of June 1 from about 71,000 operators sampled from a list of agricultural producers plus data from operators of 22,000 small land area tracts. Information was collected during the first half of June by mail, telephone, and personal interviews. Since all operations raising hogs were not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is approximately one and one-half percent at the U.S. level for hog inventory. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that survey estimates will be within three percent of the value developed by all possible samples selected from the same population and surveyed using the same procedures. The relative standard errors for the major groupings of market and breeding hogs were 1.6 and 2.0 percent, respectively. The relative standard error for the market hog weight groups ranged from 1.8 to 2.3 percent.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording, and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

The sampling variability of survey estimates on intended farrowings is slightly larger than that for inventories. More important, actual farrowings may differ significantly from reported intentions due to unexpected economic and environmental conditions. For June-August second intentions in the 10 quarterly States, these differences have exceeded two percent in four of the last ten years. For September - November first intentions in the 10 quarterly States as of June 1, these differences have exceeded six percent in three of the last ten years.

In setting the inventory estimates, the Agricultural Statistics Board constructed a U.S. balance sheet using estimates on births, deaths, and check data on slaughter, imports, and exports. This balance sheet provided an additional check on survey inventory estimates.

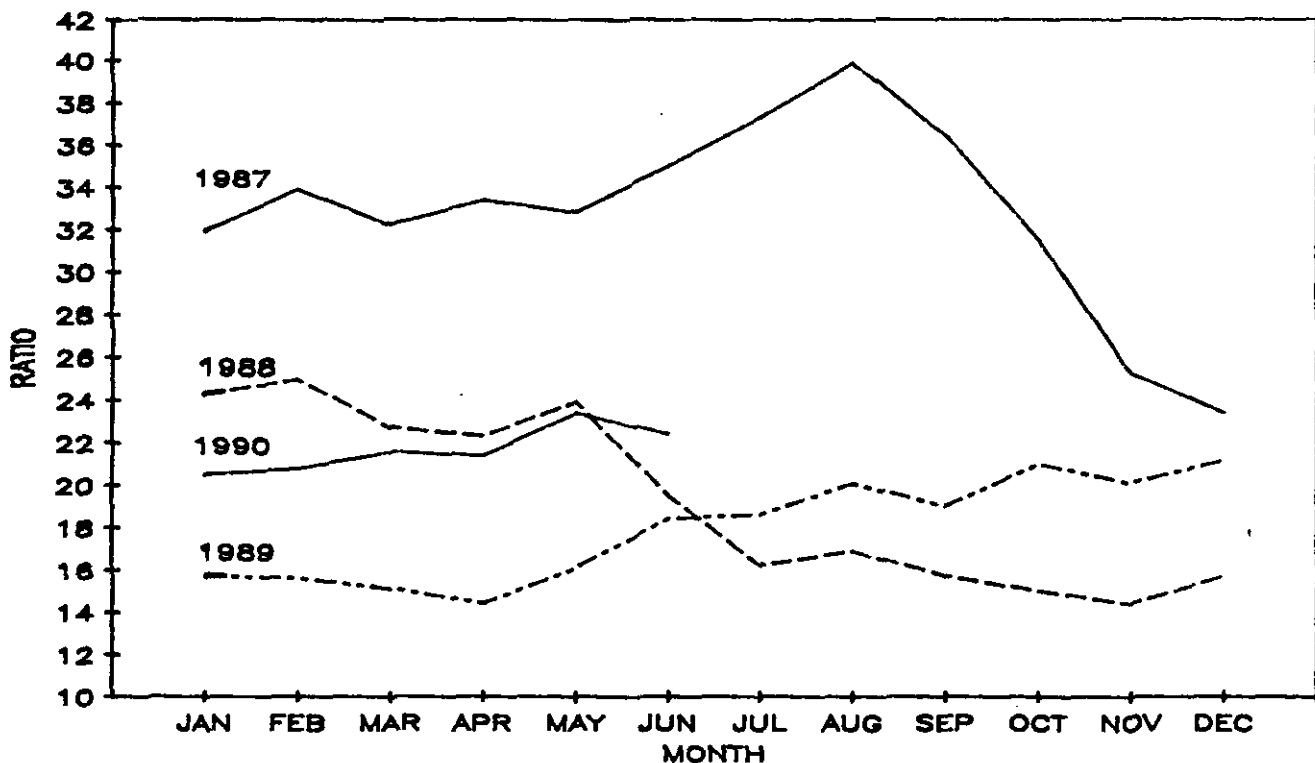

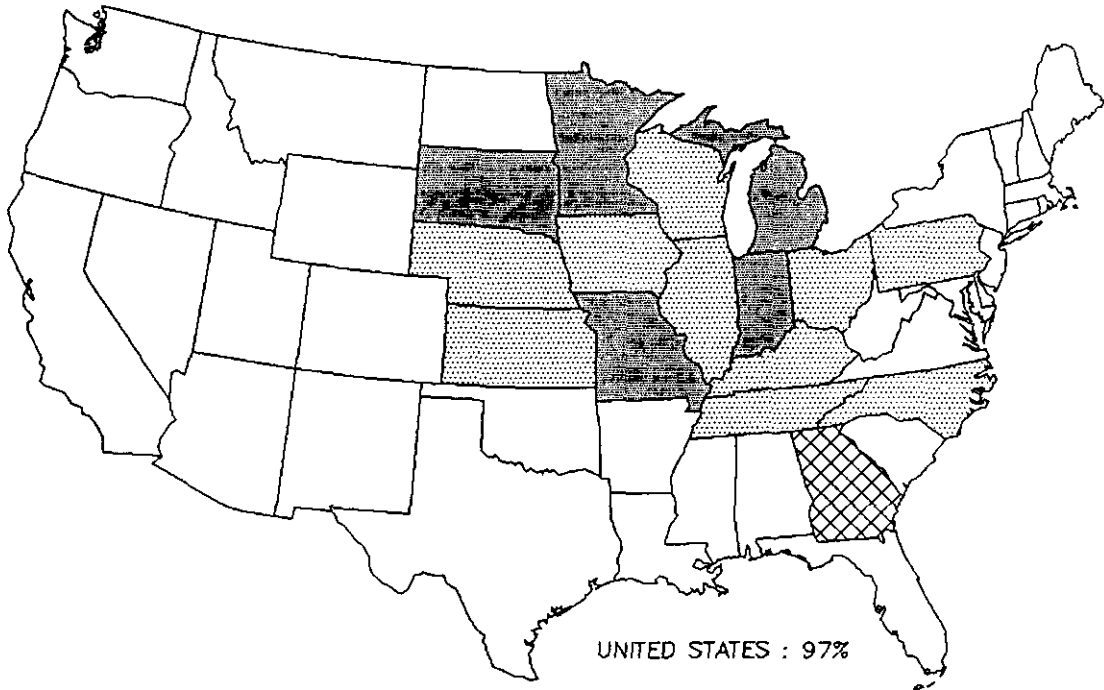

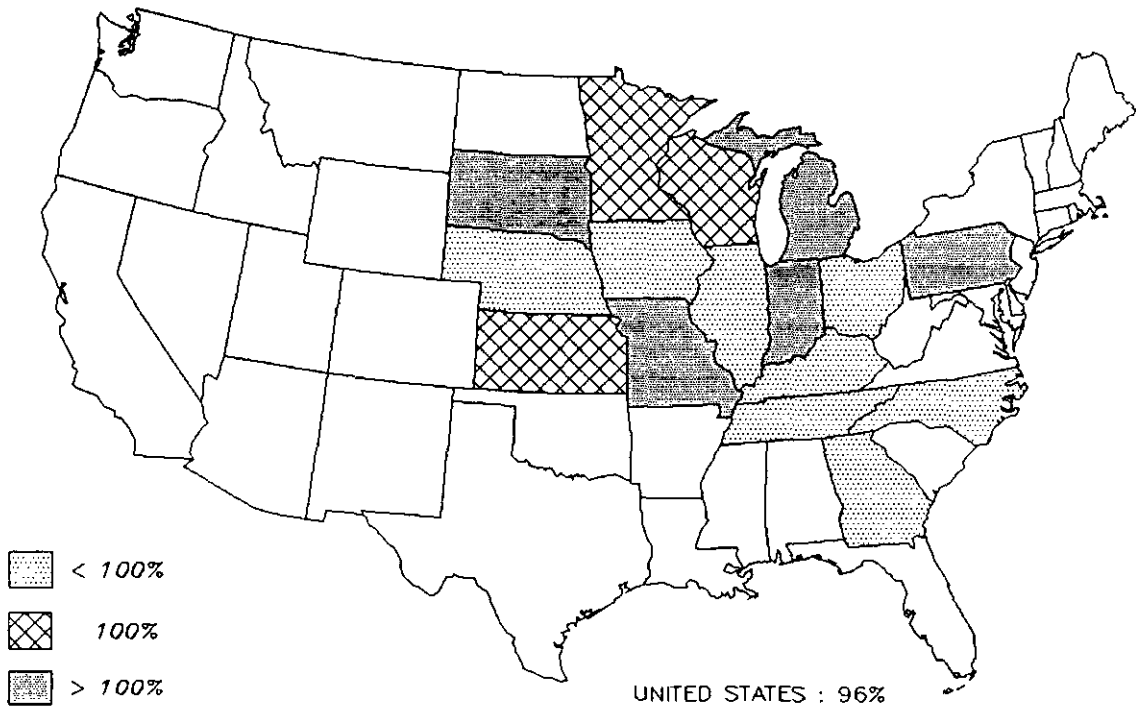
