COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in February 1986 totaled 2.94 billion pounds (1.33 million metric tons), virtually unchanged from February 1985, according to the Crop Reporting Board. January-February red meat production, at 6.42 billion pounds (2.91 million metric tons), was up 1 percent from last year. The percentage changes from 1985 is accumulated production by individual components were: beef, up 2 percent; veal, up 9 percent; pork, down 1 percent; lamb and mutton, down 3 percent. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for both February 1985 and 1986 included 20 weekdays (one a holiday) and four Saturdays.

## COMPARING FEBRUARY 1986 WITH FEBRUARY 1985

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 1.77 billion pounds (802 thousand metric tons), was virtually unchanged from the previous year. Head kill was 2.72 million, down 2 percent, however, the average live weight increased 20 pounds to 1,107.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 40 million pounds (18.1 thousand metric tons), was up 8 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 272 thousand head, up 7 percent. The average live weight increased 2 pounds to 247.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.10 billion pounds (499 thousand metric tons) declined 1 percent. Hog kill, at 6.30 million head, declined 2 percent, however, the average live weight increased 1 pound to 243.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 27 million pounds (12.3 thousand metric tons), was down 4 percent. Slaughter totaled 452 thousand head, down 7 percent. The average live weight increased 3 pounds to 118.
