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COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in March 1986 totaled 3.13 billion pounds (1.42 million metric tons), down 1 percent from March 1985, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. January-March red meat production, at 9.55 billion pounds (4.33 million metric tons), was up fractionally from last year. The 1986 accumulated production changes by individual components were: beef, up 1 percent; veal, up 8 percent; pork, down 1 percent; lamb and mutton, down 4 percent. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for both March 1985 and 1986 included 21 weekdays and five Saturdays.

COMPARING MARCH 1986 WITH MARCH 1985

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 1.86 billion pounds (844 thousand metric tons), was virtually unchanged from the previous year. Head kill was 2.84 million, down 2 percent, but the average live weight increased 18 pounds to 1110.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 43 million pounds (19.5 thousand metric tons), was up 8 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 294 thousand head, up 5 percent. The average live weight increased 8 pounds to 248.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.20 billion pounds (543 thousand metric tons), declined 3 percent. Hog kill, at 6.86 million head, declined 4 percent but the average live weight increased 2 pounds to 244.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 32 million pounds (14.5 thousand metric tons), was down 3 percent. Slaughter totaled 540 thousand head, down 7 percent. The average live weight increased 2 pounds to 117.
