COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in April 1986 totaled 3.48 billion pounds (1.58 million metric tons), up 6 percent from April 1985, to a new April record high, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. The previous April record was 3.32 billion pounds (1.50 million metric tons) in 1980. January-April red meat production, at 13.0 billion pounds (5.91 million metric tons), was up 2 percent from last year. The 1986 accumulated production changes by individual components were: beef, up 3 percent; veal, up 9 percent; pork, down 1 percent; lamb and mutton, down 4 percent. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for both April 1985 and 1986 included 22 weekdays and 4 Saturdays.

## COMPARING APRIL 1986 WITH APRIL 1985

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 2.11 billion pounds (958 thousand metric tons), was up 9 percent from the previous year. Head kill was 3.22 million, up 8 percent and the average live weight increased 12 pounds to 1110.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 45 million pounds (20.4 thousand metric tons), was up 10 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 303 thousand head, up 12 percent. The average live weight decreased 1 pound to 253.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.29 billion pounds (586 thousand metric tons), was up fractionally. Hog kill of 7.35 million head was down fractionally. The average live weight was unchanged at 245 pounds.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 29 million pounds (13.2 thousand metric tons), was down 3 percent. Slaughter totaled 492 thousand head, down 8 percent. The average live weight increased 5 pounds to 118.
