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COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in May 1986 totaled 3.39 billion pounds (1.54 million metric tons), down 3 percent from May 1985, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. January-May red meat production, at 16.4 billion pounds (7.45 million metric tons), was up 1 percent from last year. The percentage changes in accumulated production by individual components were: beef, up 3; veal, up 8; pork, down 3; lamb and mutton, down 6. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in Federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for May 1986 included 22 weekdays (one a holiday) and five Saturdays. Kill days for May 1985 consisted of 23 weekdays (one a holiday) and four Saturdays.

COMPARING MAY 1986 WITH MAY 1985

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 2.11 billion pounds (957 thousand metric tons), was up 1 percent. Head kill totaled 3.24 million, up 2 percent, however, the average live weight decreased 2 pounds to 1102.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 43 million pounds (19.5 thousand metric tons), was up 2 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 276 thousand head, up 4 percent. The average live weight decreased 4 pounds to 262.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.21 billion pounds (549 thousand metric tons), was down 9 percent from the previous year. Hog kill totaled 6.88 million head, a decline of 9 percent. The average live weight decreased 2 pounds to 245.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 25 million pounds (11.3 thousand metric tons), was down 14 percent. Slaughter totaled 431 thousand head, down 15 percent. The average live weight increased by 3 pounds to 116.
