COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in September 1986 totaled 3.26 billion pounds (1.48 million metric tons), up fractionally from September 1985, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. January-September red meat production, at 29.3 billion pounds (13.3 million metric tons), was virtually the same as a year earlier. The percentage changes in accumulated production by individual components were: beef, up 3; veal, up 7; pork, down 5; lamb and mutton, down 5. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in Federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for September 1986 consisted of 22 weekdays (one a holiday) and four Saturdays. Kill days for September 1985 included 21 weekdays (one a holiday) and four Saturdays.

COMPARING SEPTEMBER 1986 WITH SEPTEMBER 1985

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 2.05 billion pounds (930 thousand metric tons), was up 3 per cent. Head kill totaled 3.13 million, up 4 percent. The average live weight decreased 7 pounds to 1102.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 43 million pounds (19.5 thousand metric tons), was up 2 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 281 thousand head, down 4 percent; however, the average live weight increased 12 pounds to 255.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.14 billion pounds (516 thousand metric tons), was down 5 percent. Hog kill totaled 6.50 million head, down 6 percent. The average live weight increased 3 pounds to 245.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 30 million pounds (13.6 thousand metric tons), was up 7 percent. Slaughter totaled 511 thousand head, up 3 percent. The average live weight increased 4 pounds to 116.
