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COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in February 1990 totaled 2.97 billion pounds, down 1 percent from last year, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. January-February red meat production, at 6.32 billion pounds was up 1 percent from last year. Percentage changes for 1990 accumulated production by individual components were: beef, virtually unchanged; veal, down 15; pork, up 2; lamb and mutton, up 13. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in Federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for February 1990 included 20 weekdays (one holiday) and four Saturdays. Kill days for February 1989 consisted of 20 weekdays (one holiday) and four Saturdays.

COMPARING FEBRUARY 1990 WITH FEBRUARY 1989

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 1.71 billion pounds was down 2 percent. Head kill totaled 2.50 million, down 3 percent. The average live weight increased 13 pounds to 1,146.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 24.0 million pounds was down 14 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 150 thousand head, down 17 percent, and the average live weight increased 3 pounds to 266.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.22 billion pounds was up 1 percent. Hog kill totaled 6.82 million head, up slightly from last year. The average live weight increased 1 pound to 248.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 29.0 million pounds was up 7 percent from last year. Slaughter totaled 441 thousand head, up 4 percent. The average live weight increased 4 pounds to 130.
