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COMMERCIAL RED MEAT PRODUCTION for the United States in April 1990 totaled 3.05 billion pounds, down 3 percent from last year, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. January-April red meat production, at 12.6 billion pounds, was down 1 percent from last year. Percentage changes for 1990 accumulated production by individual components were: beef, down fractionally; veal, down 14; pork, down 1; lamb and mutton, up 9. Commercial red meat production includes slaughter in Federally inspected and other plants, but excludes animals slaughtered on farms.

Kill days for April 1990 included 21 weekdays (no holiday) and four Saturdays. Kill days for April 1989 consisted of 20 weekdays (no holiday) and five Saturdays.

COMPARING APRIL 1990 WITH APRIL 1989

BEEF PRODUCTION, at 1.75 billion pounds was down 1 percent. Head kill totaled 2.62 million, down 1 percent. The average live weight decreased 1 pound to 1114.

VEAL PRODUCTION, at 23.0 million pounds was down 15 percent. Calf slaughter totaled 133 thousand head, down 16 percent, and the average live weight decreased 11 pounds to 275.

PORK PRODUCTION, at 1.25 billion pounds was down 6 percent. Hog kill totaled 6.96 million head, down 6 percent from last year. The average live weight decreased 1 pound to 249.

LAMB AND MUTTON PRODUCTION, at 31.0 million pounds was up 19 percent from last year. Slaughter totaled 487 thousand head, up 19 percent. The average live weight decreased 2 to 124 pounds.
