## JANUARY MILK PRODUCTION 2 PERCENT ABOVE PREVIOUS YEAR

Milk production during January 1983 totaled 11.3 billion pounds, (5.12 million metric tons), 2 percent more than January 1982.

January production per cow averaged 1021 pounds, 13 pounds above a year earlier and 27 pounds above January 1981.

Total milk cows averaged 11.1 million head, slightly higher than a year earlier and 2 percent above January 1981.

1982 MILK PRODUCTION A RECORD HIGH

Milk production during 1982 totaled a record high 136 billion pounds (61.6 million metric tons), 2 percent more than the previous record high of 133 billion pounds (60.3 million metric tons) set in 1981. Output per cow in 1982 was also a record high, at 12,316 pounds, 139 pounds above the previous record set during 1981. The annual average number of cows was 11.0 million head, 1 percent above the 1981 average of 10.9 million head.

Wisconsin remained the leading milk producer in 1982 with 23.2 billion pounds, followed by: California, 14.5 billion; New York, 11.1 billion; Minnesota, 10.3 billion; and Pennsylvania, 9.26 billion pounds. These five States produce over one-half of the U.S. output.
