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## JANUARY MILK PRODUCTION TOTALED 11.5 BILLION POUNDS

Milk production during January 1984 totaled 11.5 billion pounds, (5.21 million metric tons), virtually unchanged from the previous year.

January production per cow averaged 1039 pounds, 3 pounds above a year earlier and 31 pounds above January 1982.

Total milk cows averaged 11.1 million head, virtually unchanged from the previous year.

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### 1983 MILK PRODUCTION A RECORD HIGH

Milk production during 1983 totaled a record high 140 billion pounds (63.5 million metric tons), 3 percent more than the previous record high of 136 billion pounds (61.6 million metric tons) set in 1982. Output per cow in 1983, at 12.6 thousand pounds, was also a record high 278 pounds above the previous record set in 1982. The annual average number of cows was 11.1 million head, 1 percent above the 1982 average of 11.0 million head.

Wisconsin, with 23.8 billion pounds, remained the leading milk producer in 1983 followed by: California, 14.8 billion; New York, 11.7 billion; Minnesota, 10.9 billion; and Pennsylvania, 9.51 billion pounds. These five States produce over one-half of the U.S. milk.
