## APRIL MILK PRODUCTION TOTALED 12.0 BILLION POUNDS

Milk production during April 1985 totaled 12.0 billion pounds, (5.45 million metric tons), 3 percent more than April 1984.

Accumulated milk production for the first four months totaled 45.6 billion pounds (20.7 million metric tons), virtually the same as the comparable period in 1984.

Production per cow averaged 1101 pounds, 22 pounds more than April 1984.

The average number of milk cows in herds averaged 10.9 million head during April 1985, 1 percent more than both April 1984 and March 1985.

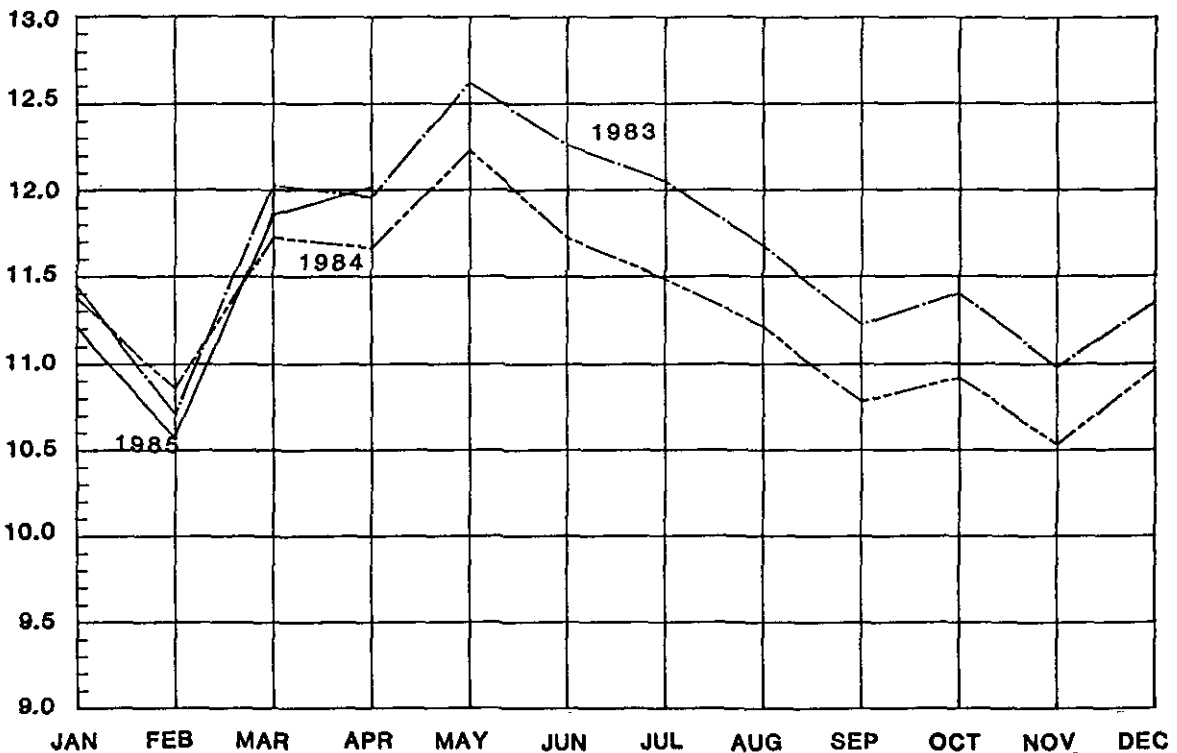
