PEANUT STOCKS AND PROCESSING FEBRUARY 28, 1989

Peanut stocks in commercial storage on February 28, 1989, totaled 2.66 billion pounds of equivalent farmer stock. This total includes 1.73 billion pounds of actual farmer stock.

Shelled peanuts on hand totaled 878 million pounds of equivalent farmer stock. Roasting stock totaled 51.5 million pounds. There were 328 million pounds of Commodity Credit Corporation uncommitted stock on hand as of February 28, 1989.

Shelled peanut stocks on February 28, 1989, totaled 660 million pounds of which 625 million pounds were edible grades and 35.1 million pounds were oil stocks. Edible grade stocks by type were: Virginias, 136 million pounds; Runners, 439 million pounds; and Spanish, 49.8 million pounds.

MILLINGS

February millings totaled 406 million pounds. Millings by type were 78.8 million pounds of Virginias, 311 million pounds of Runners, and 16.9 million pounds of Spanish.

EDIBLE USE AND CRUSHINGS

Commercial processors utilized 125 million pounds of shelled edible grade peanuts during February. Utilization for peanut butter was 73.8 million pounds, utilization for peanut candy was 26.5 million pounds, and utilization for salted peanuts was 20.6 million pounds.

Crushings for oil, cake, and meal totaled 50.2 million pounds during the month.

Deliveries under the Government Domestic Feeding and Child Nutrition Programs amounted to 5,309,821 pounds of peanut butter, 770,400 pounds of roasted peanuts, and no peanut granules during the month of February.

STOCKS OF TREATED SEED

Stocks of treated seed on hand as of February 28, 1989, totaled 8.67 million pounds, compared with 4.43 million pounds on January 31, 1989. Of the February total, 4.25 million pounds were Virginias and Valencias, 4.35 million pounds were Runners, and 73.2 thousand pounds were Spanish. January stocks of seed included 3.27 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 1.09 million pounds of Runners, and 73.3 thousand pounds of Spanish.

These Statistics are collected and presented according to the Peanut Statistics Act which requires shellers, crushers and processors of raw peanuts to submit periodic reports for their operations. These reports are based on a complete enumeration of all shellers and crushers and all of the larger processors of raw peanuts. However, because of the number of processors of raw peanuts, reports are occasionally received too late to be included in the first tabulation. Allowances are made for these missing reports and revised totals are published in the next report.
