PEANUT STOCKS AND PROCESSING FEBRUARY 28, 1990

Peanut stocks in commercial storage on February 28, 1990 totaled 2.41 billion pounds of equivalent farmer stock. This total includes 1.47 billion pounds of actual farmer stock.

Shelled peanuts on hand totaled 878 million pounds of equivalent farmer stock. Roasting stock totaled 58.7 million pounds. There were 123 million pounds of Commodity Credit Corporation uncommitted stocks on hand as of February 28, 1990.

Shelled peanut stocks on February 28, 1990 totaled 660 million pounds of which 634 million pounds were edible grades and 25.6 million pounds were oil stocks. Edible grade stocks by type were: Virginias, 143 million pounds; Runners, 441 million pounds; and Spanish, 50.4 million pounds.

MILLINGS

February millings totaled 444 million pounds. Millings by type were 90.0 million pounds of Virginias, 336 million pounds of Runners, and 18.0 million pounds of Spanish.

EDIBLE USE AND CRUSHINGS

Commercial processors utilized 130 million pounds of **SHELLED EDIBLE** grade peanuts during February. Utilization for all peanut butter products was 75.8 million pounds, utilization for peanut candy was 29.1 million pounds, and utilization for salted peanuts was 22.0 million pounds. **CRUSHINGS** for oil, cake, and meal totaled 35.7 million pounds during the month.

Deliveries under the Government Domestic Feeding and Child Nutrition Programs amounted to 7,504,129 pounds of peanut butter, 799,200 pounds of roasted peanuts, and 23,100 pounds of peanut granules during the month of February.

STOCKS OF TREATED SEED

Stocks of treated seed on hand as of February 28, 1990 totaled 15.9 million pounds, compared with 3.70 million pounds on January 31, 1990. Of the February total, 5.30 million pounds were Virginias and Valencias, 10.6 million pounds were Runners, and 13.0 thousand pounds were Spanish. January stocks of seed included 3.65 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 40.0 thousand pounds of Runners, and 16.0 thousand pounds of Spanish.

These Statistics are collected and presented according to the Peanut Statistics Act which requires shellers, crushers and processors of raw peanuts to submit periodic reports for their operations. These reports are usually based on a complete enumeration of all shellers and crushers and all of the larger processors of raw peanuts. However, reports are occasionally received too late to be included in the first tabulation. Allowances are made for these missing reports and revised totals are published in the next report.
