## PEANUT STOCKS AND PROCESSING MARCH 31, 1990

Peanut stocks in commercial storage on March 31, 1990 totaled 2.13 billion pounds of equivalent farmer stock. This total includes 1.10 billion pounds of actual farmer stock.

Shelled peanuts on hand totaled 966 million pounds of equivalent farmer stock. Roasting stock totaled 64.5 million pounds. There were 72.9 million pounds of Commodity Credit Corporation uncommitted stocks on hand as of March 31, 1990.

Shelled peanut stocks on March 31, 1990 totaled 726 million pounds of which 663 million pounds were edible grades and 63.5 million pounds were oil stocks. Edible grade stocks by type were: Virginias, 136 million pounds; Runners, 471 million pounds; and Spanish, 55.7 million pounds.

### MILLINGS

March millings totaled 438 million pounds. Millings by type were 81.6 million pounds of Virginias, 339 million pounds of Runners, and 17.7 million pounds of Spanish.

### EDIBLE USE AND CRUSHINGS

Commercial processors utilized 129 million pounds of **SHELLED EDIBLE** grade peanuts during March. Utilization for all peanut butter products was 75.8 million pounds, utilization for peanut candy was 25.5 million pounds, and utilization for salted peanuts was 24.8 million pounds. **CRUSHINGS** for oil, cake, and meal totaled 41.6 million pounds during the month.

Deliveries under the Government Domestic Feeding and Child Nutrition Programs amounted to 6,572,459 pounds of peanut butter, 374,400 pounds of roasted peanuts, and no peanut granules during the month of March.

### STOCKS OF TREATED SEED

Stocks of treated seed on hand as of March 31, 1990 totaled 31.8 million pounds, compared with 15.9 million pounds on February 28, 1990. Of the March total, 8.33 million pounds were Virginias and Valencias, 23.2 million pounds were Runners, and 216 thousand pounds were Spanish. February stocks of seed included 5.30 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 10.6 million pounds of Runners, and 13.0 thousand pounds of Spanish.

These Statistics are collected and presented according to the Peanut Statistics Act which requires shellers, crushers and processors of raw peanuts to submit periodic reports for their operations. These reports are usually based on a complete enumeration of all shellers and crushers and all of the larger processors of raw peanuts. However, reports are occasionally received too late to be included in the first tabulation. Allowances are made for these missing reports and revised totals are published in the next report.
