

# PIG CROP REPORT

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## FALL SOWS IN 10 STATES UP 4 PERCENT:

The number of sows farrowed or intended to farrow in the fall of 1962 (June through November) for 10 Corn Belt States is 4 percent more than in 1961, 7 percent more than during 1960, and 20 percent more than the 1951-60 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. The number is now estimated at 4,643,000 head for the 10 States (Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, South Dakota, Nebraska, and Kansas). Fall farrowings are up from a year earlier in all 10 of these States ranging from 1 percent in Wisconsin to 14 percent in South Dakota. Other increases are: 2 percent in each, Ohio and Nebraska; 3 percent in each, Illinois and Indiana; 4 percent in each, Iowa and Minnesota; 6 percent in Missouri; and 7 percent in Kansas. The September 1 survey indicates an increase of 41,000 sows or one percentage point from the farrowing intentions reported for these States as of June 1, 1962. The 10 States included in this report accounted for 77 percent of the United States 1961 total pig crop.

## JUNE-AUGUST FARROWINGS UP 4 PERCENT:

Sows farrowed in the 10 States during June, July, and August totaled 2,398,000 head, 4 percent more than for this period a year earlier. This is slightly more than was indicated for this period in June. June-August farrowings for these 10 States are 52 percent of the estimated June-November total, the same as in 1961 and 1 percentage point below the average of 53 percent. Farmers' reports indicate that the number of sows farrowed in June was less than a year earlier with July and August farrowings exceeding those of a year earlier.

## SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER FARROWINGS UP 4 PERCENT:

Sows bred and intended for farrowing in September, October, and November of this year in the 10 States totaled 2,245,000 head, 4 percent more than a year earlier and 23 percent more than the average. This number is 33,000 head more than intended for this period in June.

## DECEMBER-FEBRUARY INTENTIONS UP 4 PERCENT:

Reported breeding intentions indicate 1,912,000 sows to farrow during the 1963 winter quarter (December-February), compared with 1,830,000 sows farrowed during the same period a year earlier. This is an increase of 4 percent. All States indicate more sows to farrow during this quarter than a year earlier. Increases are South Dakota, 18 percent; Minnesota, 10 percent; Ohio, 7 percent; Indiana and Wisconsin, each 6 percent; Nebraska, 5 percent; Missouri, 4 percent; Illinois, 3 percent; Kansas, 2 percent; and Iowa, 1 percent.

ALL HOGS AND PIGS UP SLIGHTLY:

The number of all hogs and pigs on farms September 1, 1962 in the 10 States totaled 50,520,000 head. This is slightly more than the 50,370,000 on hand a year earlier. Increases in 6 of the States were partially offset by decreases in the remaining 4 States. Hogs and pigs 6 months old and over totaled 10,032,000 head, 1 percent more than last year. The number under 6 months of age was about the same as a year earlier. The 4 percent increase in the number of pigs under 3 months old is about the same as the percentage increase in the number of sows farrowed during the June-August period. A decrease in the average size of litters as compared with a year earlier was offset by an increase in shipments of feeder pigs. The 16,963,000 head under 3 months of age accounted for 34 percent of all hogs and pigs compared with 33 percent a year ago. The number of hogs and pigs 3-6 months of age was 2 percent less than September 1, 1961. The 23,525,000 head in the 3-6 month age group comprised 47 percent of the September 1 total compared with 48 percent a year ago.

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
