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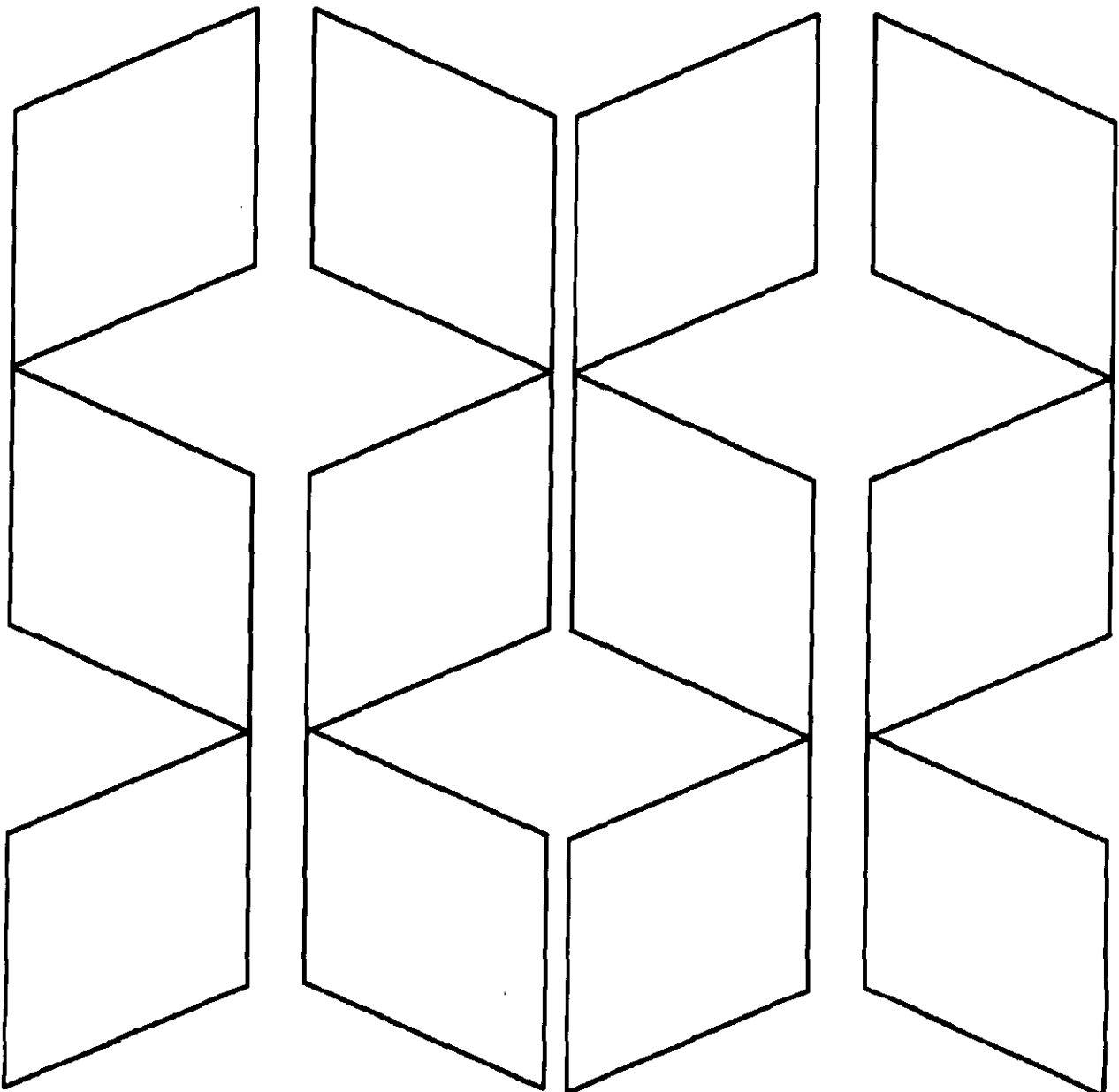

Poultry Production and Value 1992 Summary



Poultry

Production and Value, by States, 1991-92

Value of Production and Sales Up 2 Percent

The combined value of production from broilers, eggs, and turkeys and the value of sales from chickens in 1992, was \$15.0 billion, up 2 percent from the \$14.7 billion in 1991. Of the combined total, 61 percent was from broilers, 23 percent from eggs, 16 percent from turkeys, and more than one-half of 1 percent from other chickens.

Value of Broiler Production Up 9 Percent

The value of broilers produced during 1992 was \$9.16 billion, up 9 percent from the \$8.38 billion in 1991. The total number of broilers produced in 1992 was 6.39 billion, up 4 percent from 1991. The 1992 average price per pound on a liveweight equivalent basis was 31.8 cents per pound, compared to 30.8 cents per pound in 1991.

Value of Egg Production Down 13 Percent

Value of egg production in 1992 was \$3.39 billion, down 13 percent from the \$3.91 billion in 1991. Egg production totaled 70.5 billion eggs, up 2 percent from the 69.2 billion eggs produced in 1991. In 1992, eggs averaged 57.7 cents per dozen, compared with 67.8 cents in 1991.

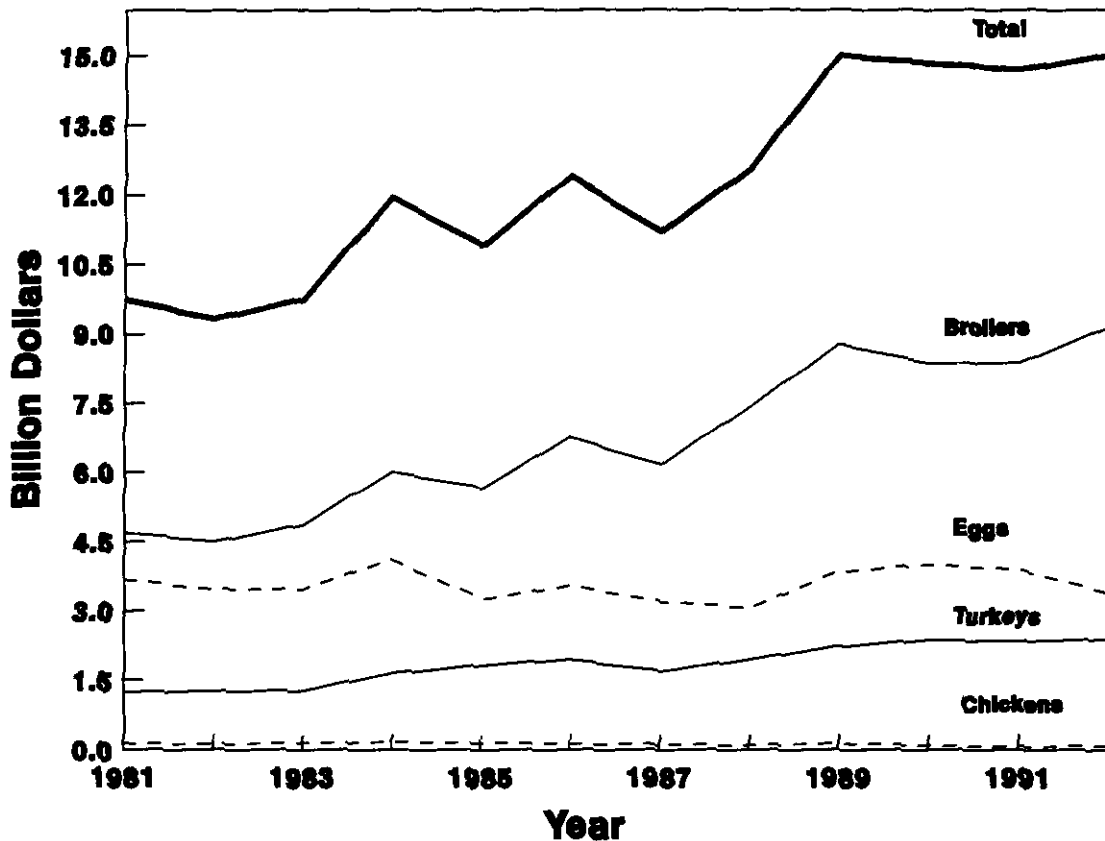
Value of Turkey Production Up 2 Percent

The value of turkeys produced during 1992 was \$2.39 billion, up 2 percent from the \$2.34 billion the previous year. Turkey production in 1992 totaled 6.33 billion pounds liveweight, compared with 6.11 billion pounds in 1991. The prices received by producers during 1992 averaged 38.0 cents per pound of liveweight, unchanged from a year earlier.

Value of Sales of Chicken Up 23 Percent

The value of sales from chickens (excluding broilers) in 1992 was \$82.9 million, up 23 percent from the \$67.3 million a year ago. Prices averaged 8.6 cents per pound compared with 7.1 cents in 1991.
