Inspected Poultry - There were 1,344 million pounds live weight of poultry (chickens, turkeys and ducks) inspected for slaughter during July 1974 by the United States Department of Agriculture. This is 9 percent more than the previous month and 8 percent above July 1973.

Young chickens inspected totaled 1,001 million pounds, up 5 percent from last month and 7 percent from July 1973. Mature chickens inspected totaled 64.2 million pounds, 11 percent below last month but 2 percent more than last year. Total turkeys inspected at 270 million pounds, were up 34 percent from the previous month and 15 percent from July 1973. Duck inspections, at 8.0 million pounds, were up 1 percent from last month and 9 percent from July 1973.

Poultry Certified Wholesome in July totaled 980 million pounds ready-to-cook weight--up 9 percent from June 1974 and 8 percent above July 1973. Of the July 1974 total, 76 percent was chilled and 24 percent was frozen.

Further Processed poultry totaled 157 million pounds ready-to-cook weight--up 9 percent from June 1974 and 5 percent from July 1973.

Poultry Cut-up and Packaged totaled 247 million pounds ready-to-cook weight--up 8 percent from last month and 7 percent from July 1973.

Ante-Mortem Condemnations during July were 9.0 million pounds live weight. This was 0.67 percent of total quantities inspected, compared with 0.71 percent a year ago. Post Mortem Condemnations were 29.1 million pounds (NYD weight). This was 2.42 percent of quantities inspected, compared with 2.95 percent in July 1973.

Total Poultry Slaughtered (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) during July 1974 was 1,002 million pounds, up 9 percent from last month and 6 percent more than July 1973.

Definitions

Young chickens - Commercially grown broilers-fryers and other young immature birds such as roasters and capons.

Mature chickens - Fowl from breeder and market egg flocks and stags and cocks.

Fryer-roaster turkeys - Young immature birds, usually under 16 weeks of age.

Young turkeys (mature) - Young birds grown to a matured market age, usually 5 to 7 months.

Old turkeys (breeders) - Fully matured birds held for egg production, usually over 15 months of age.

Ducks - Includes all ducks regardless of age and weight.

Other poultry - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the USDA Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.

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The data presented in this report were compiled from reports collected by the Meat and Poultry Inspection Program, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service.
