

# POULTRY SLAUGHTER

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JUNE 1978

LIVEWEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTION totaled 1.54 billion pounds during June 1978, 4 percent above June 1977 and 3 percent more than May 1978, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Inspection included 1.21 billion pounds of young chickens, up 4 percent from June 1977 but 3 percent below May 1978, and 77.8 million pounds of mature chickens, slightly below last year but 14 percent more than May 1978. Turkey inspections totaled 239 million pounds, up 7 percent from a year earlier and 46 percent more than May 1978. During June this year, 9.21 million pounds of ducks were inspected, 1 percent below last year but 10 percent more than May 1978.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME in June totaled 1.12 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 4 percent from both June 1977 and May 1978. Of the June 1978 total, 80 percent was chilled and 20 percent frozen.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 233 million pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 10 percent from June 1977 and 17 percent more than May 1978.

POULTRY CUT-UP AND PACKAGED totaled 359 million pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 1 percent from June 1977 but 3 percent less than May this year.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during June 1978 were 9.14 million pounds live weight. This was 0.59 percent of quantities inspected, compared with 0.44 percent a year ago. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS were 26.4 million pounds (NYD weight). This was 1.92 percent of quantities inspected, compared with 1.93 percent in June 1977.

TOTAL POULTRY SLAUGHTERED (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) during June 1978 was 1.13 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 3 percent from June 1977 and 4 percent more than May 1978.

Definitions

Young chickens - Commercially grown broilers-fryers and other immature birds such as roasters and capons.

Mature chickens - Fowl from breeder and market egg flocks and stags and cocks.

Fryer-roaster turkeys - Young immature birds, usually under 16 weeks of age.

Young turkeys (mature) - Young birds grown to a matured market age, usually 5 to 7 months.

Old turkeys (breeders) - Fully matured birds held for egg production, usually over 15 months of age.

Ducks - Includes all ducks regardless of age and weight.

Other poultry - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the USDA Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.
