

# POULTRY SLAUGHTER



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January 1980

LIVE WEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTIONS totaled 1.60 billion pounds during January 1980, up 10 percent from January 1979 and 15 percent above December 1979, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Inspections included 1.32 billion pounds of young chickens, up 6 percent from January 1979 and 18 percent above December 1979; 97.4 million pounds of mature chickens, up 25 percent from a year earlier and 48 percent above December 1979. Turkey inspections totaled 179 million pounds, up 40 percent from the same month a year ago, but 14 percent below December 1979. Duck inspections at 7.76 million pounds were up 2 percent from January 1979 and 1 percent above December 1979.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME, totaling 1.16 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight during January 1980, was up 11 percent from January 1979 and 14 percent above December 1979. The percentage breakdown for the January 1980 total is 84 percent chilled and 16 percent frozen.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 233 million pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 15 percent from January 1979, but down 1 percent from December 1979.

CUT-UP PACKAGED poultry products totaled 426 million pounds ready-to-cook weight, an increase of 13 percent from January 1979 and 12 percent above December 1979.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during January 1980 were 6.72 million pounds live weight. Percent of quantities inspected equaled .41 compared to .56 percent for January 1979. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS were 32.5 million pounds (N.Y.D. weight), 2.26 percent of quantities inspected, compared to 2.43 percent in January 1979.

POULTRY SLAUGHTERED (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) during January 1980 was 1.17 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight, up 11 percent from January 1979 and 14 percent above December 1979.

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DEFINITIONS

YOUNG CHICKENS - COMMERCIALY GROWN BROILERS-FRYERS AND OTHER YOUNG IMMATURE BIRDS SUCH AS ROASTERS AND CAPONS.

MATURE CHICKENS - FOWL FROM BREEDER AND MARKET EGG FLOCKS AND STAGS AND COCKS.

FRYER-ROASTERS TURKEYS - YOUNG IMMATURE BIRDS, USUALLY UNDER 16 WEEKS OF AGE.

YOUNG TURKEYS (MATURE) - YOUNG BIRDS GROWN TO A MATURED MARKET AGE, USUALLY 5 TO 7 MONTHS.

OLD TURKEYS (BREEDERS) - FULLY MATURED BIRDS HELD FOR EGG PRODUCTION, USUALLY OVER 15 MONTHS OF AGE.

DUCKS - INCLUDES ALL DUCKS REGARDLESS OF AGE AND WEIGHT.

OTHER POULTRY - INCLUDES ALL OTHER READY-TO-COOK PRODUCTS WHICH BEAR THE U.S.D.A. INSPECTED FOR WHOLESOMENESS LEGEND.
