

# POULTRY SLAUGHTER

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August 1980

LIVE WEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTIONS totaled 1.59 billion pounds during August, down 14 percent from August 1979, and 3 percent below July 1980, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Inspections included 1.25 billion pounds of young chickens, down 12 percent from August 1979, and 2 percent less than July 1980; 49.7 million pounds of mature chickens, down 40 percent from August 1979 and 4 percent below July 1980. Turkey inspections totaled 284 million pounds, down 16 percent from August 1979 and 6 percent below July 1980. Duck inspections totaled 9.09 million pounds, down 20 percent from the comparable month a year earlier and 9 percent below July 1980.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME totaled 1.17 billion pounds, down 14 percent from August 1979 and 3 percent from July 1980. The August 1980 percentage breakdown was 78 percent chilled and 22 percent frozen.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 296 million pounds, ready-to-cook weight, 2 percent below August a year ago and 1 percent below July 1980.

CUT-UP PACKAGED poultry products totaled 448 million pounds, 4 percent greater than August 1979 but 1 percent below July 1980.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during August 1980 were 8.51 million pounds live weight. Percent of quantities inspected equaled 0.53 compared with 0.60 percent during August a year earlier. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS were 27.7 million pounds (N.Y.D. Weight), 1.94 percent of quantities inspected compared with 2.11 percent during August 1979.

POULTRY SLAUGHTERED (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) was 1.17 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight, 14 percent below August 1979 and 3 percent below July 1980.

Definitions

Young chickens - Commercially grown broilers-fryers and other young immature birds such as roasters and capons.

Mature chickens - Fowl from breeder and market egg flocks and stags and cocks.

Fryer-roaster turkeys - Young immature birds, usually under 16 weeks of age.

Young turkeys (mature) - Young birds grown to a matured market age, usually 5 to 7 months.

Old turkeys (breeders) - Fully matured birds held for egg production, usually over 15 months of age.

Ducks - Includes all ducks regardless of age and weight.

Other poultry - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the U.S.D.A. Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.
