

# POULTRY SLAUGHTER



Economics and  
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LIVE WEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTIONS totaled 1.45 billion pounds during November, down 6 percent from November 1979, and 19 percent below October 1980, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

Inspections included 1.08 billion pounds of young chickens, down 4 percent from November 1979, and 20 percent below October 1980; 53.9 million pounds of mature chickens, down 14 percent from November 1979, and 32 percent below October 1980. Turkey inspections totaled 305 million pounds, down 8 percent from November 1979, and 11 percent below October 1980. Duck inspections totaled 7.89 million pounds, down 6 percent from the comparable month a year earlier, and 20 percent below October 1980.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME totaled 1.07 billion pounds, down 5 percent from November 1979, and 19 percent from October 1980. The November 1980 percentage breakdown was 77 percent chilled and 23 percent frozen.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 270 million pounds, ready-to-cook weight, down 2 percent from November a year earlier and 26 percent below October 1980.

CUT-UP PACKAGED poultry products totaled 410 million pounds, up 13 percent from November 1979, but 18 percent below October 1980.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during November 1980 were 4.08 million pounds live weight. Percent of quantities inspected equaled 0.28 compared with 0.33 percent during November of last year. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS totaled 24.2 million pounds (N.Y.D. Weight), 1.85 percent of quantities inspected. The Post-Mortem condemnations comparable for November 1979 were 2.08 percent of quantities inspected.

POULTRY SLAUGHTERED (including that slaughtered in non-federally inspected plants) was 1.07 billion pounds ready-to-cook weight, down 6 percent from November 1979, and 19 percent below October 1980.

Definition

Young chickens - Commercially grown broilers-fryers and other young immature birds such as roasters and capons.

Mature chickens - Fowl from breeder and market egg flocks and stags and cocks.

Fryer-roaster turkeys - Young immature birds, usually under 16 weeks of age.

Young turkeys (mature) - Young birds grown to a matured market age, usually 5 to 7 months.

Old turkeys (breeders) - Fully matured birds held for egg production, usually over 15 months of age.

Ducks - Includes all ducks regardless of age and weight.

Other poultry - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the U.S.D.A. Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.
