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The preliminary total of LIVE WEIGHT POULTRY INSPECTION was 2.20 billion pounds (1.00 million metric tons) for January 1988.

Inspections included 1.79 billion pounds (813 thousand metric tons) of young chickens, 76.3 million pounds (34.6 thousand metric tons) of mature chickens, 322 million pounds (146 thousand metric tons) of turkeys and 12.0 million pounds (5420 metric tons) of ducks.

POULTRY CERTIFIED WHOLESOME during January 1988 was 1.61 billion pounds (729 thousand metric tons) ready to cook weight. Updated totals for December 1987 show that 1.69 billion pounds (768 thousand metric tons) were certified.

ANTE-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS during January 1988 totaled 11.2 million pounds (5090 metric tons). Condemnations were 0.50 percent of the live weight inspected compared with 0.39 percent a year ago. POST-MORTEM CONDEMNATIONS, at 47.7 million pounds (21.6 thousand metric tons) (N.Y. Dressed Weight), were 2.41 percent of quantities inspected compared with 2.17 percent a year earlier.

FURTHER PROCESSED poultry totaled 559 million pounds (254 thousand metric tons) ready-to-cook weight. CUT-UP poultry totaled 800 million pounds (363 thousand tons).

DEFINITIONS USED TO REPORT FEDERALLY INSPECTED SLAUGHTER:

YOUNG CHICKENS - Commercially grown broilers-fryers and other young immature birds such as roasters and capons.

MATURE CHICKENS - Fowl from breeder and market egg flocks and stags and cocks.

FRYER-ROASTER TURKEYS - Young immature birds, usually under 16 weeks of age.

YOUNG TURKEYS (MATURE) - Young birds grown to a matured market age, about 5 months.

OLD TURKEYS (BREEDERS) - Fully matured birds held for egg production, usually over 15 months of age.

DUCKS - Includes all ducks regardless of age and weight.

OTHER POULTRY - Includes all other ready-to-cook products which bear the U.S.D.A. Inspected for Wholesomeness legend.
