ALL SHEEP AND LAMB INVENTORY in the United States on January 1, 1982 totaled 13.1 million head, according to the Crop Reporting Board, up 1 percent from the 12.9 million head a year earlier. The value of all sheep and lambs on hand January 1, 1982, totaled \$747 million, down 17 percent from a year ago. The average value per head was \$56.90, down \$12.90 from last year.

STOCK SHEEP INVENTORY was 11.6 million head, 2 percent above January 1, 1981. Ewes one year old and older, at 8.91 million head, were up 2 percent. Ewe lambs also increased 2 percent to 1.82 million. Wether and ram lambs were 20 percent higher than last year.

SHEEP AND LAMBS ON FEED January 1, 1982, for slaughter market in the 24 major feeding States were down 5 percent from a year ago and numbered 1.56 million head.

THE 1981 LAMB CROP of 8.85 million head increased 7 percent from the 1980 crop. Breeding ewes one year old and older on January 1, 1981, were up 3 percent from a year earlier. The 1981 lambing rate was 101 lambs per 100 ewes one year old and older, compared with 97 in 1980 and 95 in 1979.

GOAT NUMBERS in Texas totaled 1.45 million head on January 1, 1982, up 5 percent from last year. Total value at \$59.5 million was up 12 percent. The average value per head increased \$2.50 to \$41.00.
