TURKEYS RAISED IN 1986 UP 12 PERCENT

Turkeys raised in the United States during 1986, at 207 million, were 12 percent greater than the 185 million raised during 1985.

North Carolina ranked first in the number raised with 39.1 million followed by Minnesota with 34.2 million; California with 21.9 million; Arkansas with 16.5 million; Virginia with 14.3 million; and Missouri with 13.5 million. These States account for over two-thirds of the turkeys produced in the United States during 1986.

TURKEY GROWERS PLAN 11 PERCENT INCREASE IN 1987

Turkey growers in 20 major producing States intend to raise 222 million turkeys in 1987, up 11 percent from the 200 million in 1986.

The number of turkeys actually raised in 1987 may vary from growers' intentions shown in this report depending on feed costs, supply of hatching eggs, cost of poults, and prices growers received for turkeys during the next few months.
